Sunday Mornings

Sunday morning services will be at 8:30 a.m. Immediately following the service, I will hasten to my vehicle, obey all traffic laws, and arrive safely, God-willing, at College Hill Lutheran Church for the 10 a.m. service. Bible class and Sunday school at Faith will begin around 9:45 a.m. starting August 28. Please plan to attend these! I will not be able to be there, of course, but I will make sure that God's holy Word will be taught in its truth and purity for your edification.

Mondays at Faith

Every Monday, I plan to pray Matins at Faith in the church proper at 9:30 a.m. (Please join me!) I hope to be available in the pastor's study from 10 a.m. until 12 noon. There will be times when I will not be there due to other commitments or

emergencies, so please call or text me beforehand if you would like to visit with me.

Wednesday Catechesis

Details for Wednesday catechesis are yet to be determined. I will be teaching the catechism at College Hill Lutheran Church from 6 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. beginning September 7th. Younger children and family members who are still working through the Old Testament and New Testament stories will most likely meet at Faith with their parents. (BTW: Parents, you are the primary instructors for your children [c.f. Deuteronomy 6:4-9; Ephesians 6:1-4], so plan to attend with them. ©). Since the life of the baptized is one of ongoing instruction in the Word of God, everyone should avail themselves of this opportunity to study the basic doctrines of Scripture as a church family (over and over and over and over...). More details will be forthcoming.

Call Process

The Call process will involve a *Call Committee* which will put together a *Call List*. Unless I am mistaken, the *Call Committee* will be the board of deacons and the chairman of the congregation. The *Call List*, which may include several names, is usually reduced to 3 or 4 pastors whom the Call Committee believes to be the best fit for serving the congregation.

A special voters' meeting will be held (date will be determined later) at which information on the 3 or 4 pastors will be provided and a vote will be taken to select the pastor to receive the Call. After the pastor has been selected, I will contact the pastor immediately to confirm that he is able to consider a Call from you (the congregation of Faith Evangelical Lutheran Church). Upon this confirmation, the Call documents will be prepared ASAP and sent through the mail.

The congregation may reasonably expect to receive a response within four weeks after the pastor has received the Call documents.

Patience

Sometimes the time of vacancy can last longer than we want it to. It is also a time when you will need to be patient with the process, patient with your fellow members, and patient with the vacancy pastor! While we pray that everything will go smoothly, and quickly, we should expect it to be difficult and long. Patience will be key.

God's Work

In the midst of all of this, God is at work. He will still provide for you. He will feed you with His holy Word and sacraments. They never fail and He never fails. I pray that our time together will prepare us to receive another faithful pastor, and ultimately to receive the crown of eternal life through the forgiveness of sins purchased by the precious blood of Christ.

We know children can be a handful in a worship service. We believe




God wants your children to be part of the worship time and so do we.

You can begin training them as soon as they can sit by themselves. To help you, here are some suggestions. First - Worship with them, teaching them the pattern of worship. Folding hands during prayers is a good place to begin and standing when the congregation does. As they get older teach them to follow the service in the hymnal or with a large print bulletin. Teach them the hymns so they can sing with you. During the sermon, let them color or play quietly.

And finally – they are children and will not be perfect. We expect an occasional "melt down" so hang in there. There is a cry room where you can sit and listen to the service till your child calms down. You can take your bulletin with you and follow along and you can even see the service through the large window looking in to the sanctuary.

Lutherans Armor Up to Defend Women By Korey Maas Wall Street Journal 7/22/16

For its modest size and relatively apolitical ethos, the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod seems to be having more than its share of days in court. Three years ago the Supreme Court unanimously vindicated one of its congregations in *Hosanna-Tabor v. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission*, which recognized that churches have broad autonomy over whom they hire. This fall the justices will take up *Trinity Lutheran v. Pauley*, a dispute over whether states can deny funds to schools with religious affiliations.

Now the synod's two million members may have reason to anticipate yet another day in court. Last week in Milwaukee the church's triennial convention passed a resolution, by a 946-89 vote, committing to support

"those who have a religious and moral objection to women participating in the selective service system and being subject to a possible draft." The text of the final resolution built on proposals by more than three dozen congregations, circuits, districts, or commissions of the synod. That such a measure was even brought to a vote indicates how swiftly the country's legal and political culture has been changing. A similar proposal mooted only three years ago was dismissed as unnecessary. Undoubtedly, some delegates even thought it paranoid posturing. Then, last December, Defense Secretary Ash Carter announced that all positions in the U.S. military, including combat roles, would be opened to women.

The order applies only to volunteers, but some fear that opening combat positions to women will make mandatory selective-service registration a legal necessity. One of the proposed resolutions at the synod's convention cited *Rostker v. Goldberg*, the 1981 Supreme Court case that upheld male-only draft registration. "Since women are excluded from combat," Justice William Rehnquist wrote for the majority, "Congress concluded that they would not be needed in the event of a draft, and therefore decided not to register them."

That logic no longer applies, as many in Washington recognize. In June the Senate passed a bill that, if approved in the House and signed by the president, will mandate female registration beginning in 2018.

The synod's carefully worded resolution does not outright condemn women's voluntarily joining the military, serving in combat, or even registering for the draft. But it does recognize that the arguments against, both theological and secular, are sufficient to warrant an individual woman's conscientious objection to military service.

That is what suggests the potential for an eventual legal challenge. Defense Department guidelines narrowly define conscientious objection as a sincere opposition "to participation in war in any form, or the bearing of arms." Lutheranism, though, isn't pacifist.

The confessional documents to which the Missouri Synod is bound, and which date back to the 16th-century Reformation begun by Martin Luther, operate within traditional just-war theory. In other words, Lutheranism has always explicitly affirmed that Christians may in good conscience bear arms if the cause is righteous.

As a corollary, the Missouri Synod has long recognized an individual's right to refuse to participate in a war he believes to be unjust. However, the last time this issue came to the fore, at the height of the Vietnam War, the synod also acknowledged that the federal government did not recognize this right. The church's 1969 convention noted that "military draft law exempts only those objectors who on the basis of conscience oppose war in every form." That convention resolved to petition the government to broaden the exemption, but the law was never changed.

It is becoming a familiar story to Christians of all denominations. After the Supreme Court made gay marriage the law of the land last year, the Missouri Synod's president, Matthew Harrison, envisioned the passage of laws that would "force faithful Christian institutions and individuals to violate consciences." He warned that Christians would soon "begin to learn what it means to be in a state of solemn conscientious objection against the state."

What he had most immediately in mind was certainly not Lutheran ladies sent to boot camp against their will. But should the Senate's bill become law, a great number of those in the Rev. Harrison's church will indeed enter a state of solemn conscientious objection. Convincing the federal government to recognize and respect it may require yet another day in court.
