

Here is a simple story intended to help you understand the results of Easter. There was once a set of identical twin brothers who were different as can be: one was very devout and upright, and the other was lawless and reckless. The first was devoted to prayer, and serving God and

neighbor, while the second was given to violence, drunkenness, promiscuity and all manner of vice. Though they were often mistaken for one another by appearance, they could not have been further apart when it came to their thoughts, words and deeds.

One night, the lawless brother played a game of high-stakes poker at a large party in front of many onlookers. After finishing a hand, and losing a great deal of money, he discovered that the man who had beaten him had cheated during the game. He became enraged and took out a knife. When the man would not return the lawless brother's money, he raised the knife, and proceeded to stab the man over, and over, and over again. When he had finished, he was saturated in the man's blood, and could now be identified by everyone at the party as the murderer. He rose and fled the scene of the crime.

When the lawless brother arrived at home, he changed his clothes quickly, throwing the bloody clothes in the bottom of the closet. He quickly ran around the house, throwing things he might need into a sack, planning to flee the city and hide from the consequences of his lawless actions. In a matter of moments, he had changed, packed, and exited the small apartment in an attempt to flee. What he never noticed was that the entire time, his devout twin was seated quietly on the couch watching everything take place.

The devout brother knew that his brother would be caught, tried and put to death for the things he had done, and his brother's death was more than he could bear. He went quietly to the closet, and put on the bloody clothes his brother had thrown in the closet. He then sat quietly on the floor and waited for the authorities to arrive. When they came, he was swiftly arrested, and was tried for his lawless brother's crimes. He was identified by witnesses as the one who had committed the murder, and he never spoke a single word in his own defense. He was found guilty, although he was without guilt. He was sentenced to death, and was executed for the sins that were not his own. All of this he did for the love of his brother.

When the lawless brother came out of hiding some time later, he learned of what his devout and loving brother had done. He felt a horrible terror of conscience about what he had done, and that his innocent brother had given his life to protect him. He went to the judge who had tried the case, and confessed his crime. "My brother

was innocent. I killed the man at the card game. I am the one who deserves to be put to death. Do with me what you will." The judge looked solemnly at the lawless brother for quite some time. Then slowly he spoke, "You are free to go." The lawless brother spoke in astonishment, replying, "But I am guilty! I cannot be set free! I deserve to die!" "Indeed you do," said the judge, "but your crime has already been paid for. The law had been satisfied. There is no longer any debt to be paid. Your brother has paid for your crime. You are free to go."

Now, simply substitute Christ for the devout brother, and you for the lawless one, and you will understand the results of Easter. The devout, upright and blameless One has taken your sins upon Himself, and paid for them all. He took your death sentence, and satisfied the law's demands. There is no debt. You are free to go. Heaven is yours on account of what Christ has done for you. Greater love has no man than He who lays down His life for His friends.

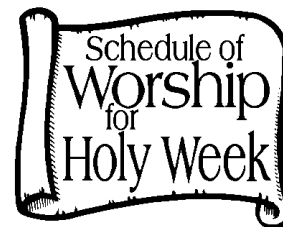

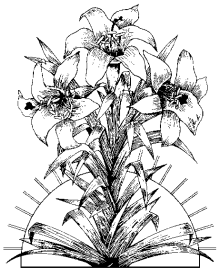

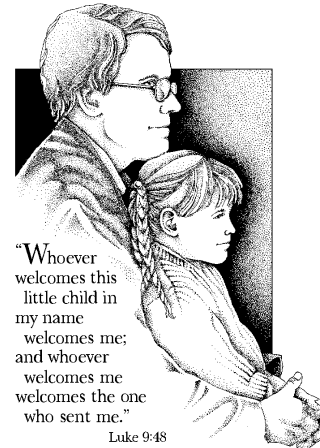
Daylight Savings Time: Remember Daylight Savings Time starts, on March 13. So turn your clocks ahead before you go to bed Saturday night.

CHILDREN IN WORSHIP

We know children can be a handful in a worship service. We believe God wants your children to be part of the worship time and so do we.



You can begin training them as soon as they can sit by themselves. To help you, here are some suggestions. First - Worship with them, teaching them the pattern of worship. Folding hands during prayers is a good place to begin and standing when the congregation does. As they get older teach them to follow the service in the hymnal or with a large print bulletin. Teach them the hymns so they can sing with you. During the sermon, let them color or play quietly.

And finally – they are children and will not be perfect. We expect an occasional “melt down” so hang in there. There is a cry room where you can sit and listen to the service till your child calms down. You can take your bulletin with you and follow along and you can even see the service through the large window looking in to the sanctuary.

This past month has reminded us that our plans are not always God's plans. Our plans were that after orientation, we would return to the U.S. briefly to obtain our visas, pack final things, and then return mid-February to Santiago to settle into our new life as a missionary family in the DR. The fact that God was blessing us with a seventh child to be born this July was simply one happy aspect of the many adjustments we would face in our new life there. So along with much of the word, we watched in disbelief a news reports began coming in about a mosquito-born virus that most have never before heard of -- The Zika Virus—which is now creeping through much of Latin America and the Caribbean. Our concern, along with OIM and Regional Director, Rev. Ted Krey, is that this virus may pose a serious risk to unborn babies. For this reason our departure is delayed, for now. We will continue to monitor the research and the news reports until it is again deemed safe to travel there, or until after the baby is born. We will keep you apprised of our on-goings as well as the littlest Preus's prenatal development in the months to come. Jennifer Preus

Zoe update and Thank you:

It's hard to believe that Zoe is celebrating her seventh birthday! God continues to guide and bless her life, forgive her sins and strengthen her with amazing faith. She is a perky, happy first grader with a zeal for learning and loves school and her many friends. She is crazy for books and reading. Her latest favorite author is Dr. Seuss and she can't get enough of those zany books! How fun!

Zoe still struggles daily with her cerebral palsy, which controls her body and any ability for independence. She relies on the care of her family, friends, teachers, therapists and specialists for her daily needs. God cares for her through the love of many others. We give thanks and praise for that great love. Thank you for your prayers and continued concern. It is a blessing to her and our family. We do not know the plans God has for Zoe but we continue to trust He has her in His hands. We ask you to please continue to keep Zoe in your daily prayers along with her family Jamie, Josh and Noah.

The following is a letter from Zoe's dad, Pastor Josh, specifically updating her medical condition. Another busy and tough summer is in Zoe's future treatment. She will continue to rely on others and we pray God will continue to keep her in His care.

I did want to share with you a little about our doctor appointments. We visited a lot regarding surgery for Zoe to implant an intrathecal baclofen pump. She weighed in at 44 pounds so she is above the 40 pound threshold for the surgery. The surgery will likely happen in early June. We also visited with two orthopedic surgeons. One of them deals with hips and back. The other deals with hands, arms, and upper body. Zoe's hips look to have remained the same again which is very positive. There has also been some concern about contractures (bones twisting) in Zoe's arms. Thankfully there are no contractures.

Zoe also had phenol and Botox injections in the operating room because she needed to be under general anesthesia. Phenol injections work on the nerve level basically creating a short-circuit in her operative nerves in her legs. This means she gets frog legs so her hips can't go out of socket. The Botox works more at the muscle level. She got an extremely high dosage this time hoping to calm her upper body down for a short time. In total she was poked about 40 times.

In all we had a very positive trip. There was a lot of information given to us that needs to soak in, but we are very thankful for God's presence, good doctors, and caring people like you who pray for us and support us in caring for Zoe.

The good news is nothing changes this program year. There will be changes for next year's program starting August 1, 2016. We will continue to support American kids through our Grand Stand for Schools sweepstakes and our community efforts which we annually contribute \$70 million in food and funding to tackle obesity and hunger among our country's most vulnerable families.
